#### Being reliable

 Accountability can make people more reliable by helping them achieve their goals and improve themselves.

In our smaller group sessions, we played a variation of Pictionary that involved students partnering up and describing a picture as best they could to their partner who would have to draw it, and then they switched. It was a fun activity that also allowed students to reflect on things that were difficult about the task.

# Pre-Kindergarten Registration 2025-2026 Is Now Open!


